This part is just a recap of what we did this summer!!!!!!

After School—Last few weeks of school were hectic fitting in a mock 5k run at the park, the Blessing of the Gardens outdoor play, *The Parable of the Sower*, with 32 people in attendance. The highlight was the releasing of the Painted Lady butterflies into KCC garden. The children had watched them grow and hatch from the larvae stage to adult. The following week we had a graduation ceremony for our 5, 5th graders and 1 Little Lamb preschooler with 20 in attendance and ice cream social. The Last day of school was water day at KCC with pools, water games and lots of fun.

Adult Bible Study-- Was going to be cancelled but Dianne Shepherd with WMU found enough volunteer teachers to cover teaching as I was on field trips with the children. We averaged 3 to 6 ladies each week. Nancy Dye brought lunch the first Thursday and Jan prepared a hot lunch every week and delivered 12 meals (to a few shut ins) She also packed 26 bags of groceries for the summer.

Speaking engagements –I had a booth set up at the spring Garden Club plant sale in May, spoke at a WMU meeting at Mill Creek Baptist, Melrose Baptist WMU and one of the WMU groups met at KCC with a cookout and time of fellowship. I went to Sweet Briar College Tuesday to Thursday, July 11 to 13 to teach quilting classes for the Fusion Camp with 32 youth.

Mission Teams- This year we had 2 groups come to KCC. Colonial Ave Baptist along with the Presbyterian church came with 12 youth to empty the food pantry and paint it a fresh white. Cave Spring Baptist had a week of serving in the valley and brought 12 to 14 older youth to work 3 hours in the morning and another group came back at 6pm to 8pm and conducted a VBS for the children. 17th Street /Access Church youth need some mission projects so I gave them several projects they could do at the church.

Little Lamb Learners- There were 4 registered. This was a new program for 6 weeks prior to school starting for preschoolers going to kindergarten this fall that had not been to a preschool. It was designed to work with parent separation, social skills, following instructions, holding a pencil, how to eat lunch, sit still during a story plus more. Mr. Warren Stewart was the only applicant which was a God answered prayer one week prior to starting. He was a 2nd year English/wrestling coach at Northside High school wanting a part time summer job. He loved it and after 2 days of watching me he took over with me, Pat Carter being the assistant most of the time. I had to finish the 2 weeks in Aug as he had to be back at Northside, but all went well.

Garden to Table—This was a new program as well for 3rd grade to 7th grade. We had 10 sign up but ended up with 3. They met mostly 3 times a week. They worked in the KCC garden, did menu planning, visited a grocery store to gather prices so they could calculate how much they could save by growing their own, harvested and weighed so we can see how much our garden produced, had a friendly competition with each other with their own corn and tomato plant, and cooked. We had a lot more planned but ran out of time.

<u>WMU Missions Overnight Camp -</u> We had 5 children sponsored for \$60 each. I took them to the camp (Ward Haven) on Monday and attended their program on Thursday and brought them back to Roanoke. I led the campfire music on Wednesday.

<u>Backyard Garden-</u>We had 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ gardens this year plus the KCC garden. We spent a little extra money on critter proofing, and it was worth it for the most part. No groundhogs, skunks, opossums ate anything. Squirrels ate most of our apples.

The gardens are for the most part producing for the families and the ones working hard are reaping produce. Totals will be reported later.

<u>Fundraiser-</u> Motorcycle ride was held July 29. 32 motorcycles signed in with several passengers. They raised \$700 which will be used to offset the after-school activity fee. They collected over 300 children's books to support reading and placed at least 2 books in all the back packs from PreK to college. The last Saturday of July has been established as the annual ride. Leo, one of our gardeners had an excess of cucumbers and tomatoes so we sold fresh SE vegetables for \$1 a pound. We sold \$20 worth.

<u>Backpack – School supplies were collected June and July. We prepared 90 bookbags with supplies for PreK to college age students.</u>

Reading & Writing & Sign Language Camp- We had 11 children attend Monday to Thursday. Jan taught them bible scripture in sign language (she is an interpreter for the deaf churches) for 15 to 20 minutes then they practiced handwriting in cursive and print for 30 minutes, took a quick snack break, and read books for 45 minutes then did a brief book talk on one book. They set their goal to read 200 books in 4 days and read 202 books.

<u>Summer Camp-</u> We had 25 children signed up but had different numbers every day. Camp started June 12 and ended August 10. The children attended 4 vacation bible schools, Bonsack Baptist, Troutville Baptist, Melrose Baptist, and Vinton Baptist. These churches provided transportation for us. Cave Spring Baptist came to us.
